ANNUAL DEVELOPMENT AGENDA FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2016-17 IN RESPECT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISHERIES

Brief Resume

The state has diverse aquaculture resources sustaining Fishery/aquaculture in the state. Fishery as a sector plays an important role in Socio-Economic upliftment of the farmers and transforming the rural economy. Most of the Schemes in fisheries are Income generating (IG) and sustaining livelihood. Fishery/Aquaculture generate employment and develops entrepreneurs through self employment. It ensures Food security specially in mitigating PEM (Protein energy mal-nutritution) deficiency plaguing rural population.

Warm and cold water Fisheries exists in the state and is given equal importance/ emphasis for its holistic development. Because of mountainous nature of topography and high elevation resource of cold water fishery as compared to warm water is relatively more and is distributed over a vast area across the state.

Number of schemes is being implemented to augment aquaculture activities in the state from state and central funding. Effective extension activities have generated enthusiasm in farmers towards aquaculture / fishery as one of the dependable economic activity in addition to agriculture which is primary occupation while in some cases as an alternate to agriculture as a source of earning. Efforts are on to accelerate growth of fisheries activities by involving individual progressive fish farmers, building up of infrastructure for sustainable growth, commercialization of fish farming, transfer of technology to the farmers, streamlining of marketing arrangement, exploitation of ornamental fish culture and its trade, capacity building of stakeholders etc. are some of the priority areas the department is concentrating to address the weakness/lacunae and to boost production & productivity of table fish and fish seed with generating employment and sustained income to the farmers of rural areas.

The schemes being implemented / proposed will generate employment / self employment and act as a catalyst in developing and strengthening rural economy while contributing to GSDP. Much emphasis has been laid on increasing productivity through dissemination and adoption of new technologies compatible with the prevailing agro climatic condition. For newer technology and FSR the Department will tie-up with different institution / Research organization of ICAR/KVKS and will ensure its application for the betterment of the Fish Farmers.

Constraints of pisciculture in Arunachal Pradesh:

Pisciculture in Arunachal Pradesh has been lagging behind in comparison to other sectors of the economy. Following are the constrains as regard to fishery development in the state.

Variable climate and altitude within the state necessitates adaptation of different technologies for different areas. Due to high rainfall and annual occurrence of flood, landslips, erosion etc. comprehensive water area suitable for pisciculture is left unutilized. Underutilization of aquatic resources in low lying areas especially in foot hills, non- availability of standard quality seeds in right time and season, inadequacy of transfer of technology from lab to land, insufficient rearing and nursing area in seed production farms for raising of quality, fish seed has accentuated the problem of increasing productivity.

There is lack of support in terms of farm side research & development (FSR) to disseminate the technology package effectively. Despite high potential in cold water fisheries the same could not be harnessed due to resource constraint and social stigma. Development of fresh water aquaculture, rivering fisheries, reservoir fisheries and other lemerging opportunities in fisheries sector will be explored to augment aquaculture. Fishery in the state. The schemes under the sector will be explored to augment aquaculture.

Performance Review.

Fish production annual that reached to the level of 4050 tons & the fish seed production to the tune of 5.5 million in terms of fry. This has been possible due to implementation of schemes like development of fresh water aquaculture, integrated fish farming, construction of new fish ponds & tanks with supply of 1st year input under NFDB, FFDA, State Plan etc. construction of commercial fish farm, establishment of low cost FRP carp hatcheries under RKVY, cold water fisheries development and effective fisheries training & extension programme. In addition to central and state government assistance a fair number of schemes are also implemented by different institutions/organizations under their outreach programmes. Combined effort has ushered in new era of aquaculture development in the state.

Number of schemes for augmenting and popularizing aquaculture/ fishery under state plan and CSS is in vogue in the state and had benefited large number of farmers. In spite of diverse topography and agro-climatic condition, it support vast resources from fisheries point of importance and a house to a number of fish species having commercial, sport and ornamental value. Development of this sector can go a long way in solving the problems of providing protein rich food to the weaker section of the society as well as gainful employment. Effort/ approach so far has been specific and in a holistic manner from the point of sustainability and sustenance.

Mentioned below are some of the added key features of this year's AOP in addition to normal activities which will definitely boost up production and productivity, generate employment and augment sustainable development of aquaculture/ fishery in the state.

Brief outline of the Schemes proposed: -

Strengthening of Govt. Fish seed farms:-

A large quantity of fish seed are still being imported from outside the state for stocking of pond, tanks and other water bodies. Emphasis has been laid to make fish seed available within accessibility of farmers by strengthening the existing Govt. Fish Seed Farms which have the required infrastructure and capacity to produce the same.

Development of Cold Water Fisheries:-

Importance of cold water fisheries as a potential source of sustained income coupled with tourism and recreational activities could not be ignored. Of late its importance in overall development of aquaculture/ fishery in the state have duly been recognized. Literally speaking this sector is still in infancy and requires tremendous efforts and budgetary support to revamp the existing infrastructure facilities of Govt. farms, hatcheries and raceways etc. Constant refining of culture and breeding techniques and dissemination of proven technology to the farmer needs to be encouraged for production of quality trout seed and table fish. Fish farmers in principle have accepted trout culture but owing to their poor economic condition much headway in this sector couldn't be made. Trout Culture in the higher belts is restricted in Tawang and West Kameng district and that too in govt. sector only. Concept of eco-tourism also needs to be developed. A large number of quality fish seed will be required to stock these high altitude aquatic resources and the infrastructure available under Government sector is supposed to play an active role in furthering the activities. Trout culture has not been popularized in private sector because of huge investment in construction of CC Raceways and inputs.

Therefore, this sector needs to be popularized among the farmers on a commercial scale in the higher belts and new area like Mechuka/Tuting, Anini etc will be included in Cold Water Fish Culture this year.

Advt. / Extension / capacity building etc: -

Extension is prerequisite for success of any scheme. Most of our farmers are ignorant about technology because of which they lack in proper management leading to low productivity and production. This discourages the farmers to pursue further. Effective extension mechanism is need of the time which not only ensures optimum utilization of resources adopting state of the art technology but helps in improving shortcomings / lacunas. Capacity building of stakeholders is a continuous process and has created a pool of trained fish farmers. Other mode of extension which includes reading materials (leaflets, pamphlets, brochures), depiction board etc. for disseminating information through will also be pursued.

Riverine conservation & awareness: -

Our open water system once supported thriving fishery of late has dwindled to an alarming state due to overexploitation, illegal fishing destruction of breeding grounds etc. Swift decline of fish catch in such water bodies is a cause of concern and need to be addressed on priority.

The best way to revive fisheries in such water bodies is through ranching and generating mass awareness especially among the riparian population in particular and the common general .NGOS and educational institutes will be involved in furthering the cause of awareness and conservation.

Backyard ornamental farm / breeding centre: -

Ornamental fish culture is an unexplored area in Arunachal Pradesh. The state is a repository of large varieties of ornamental fishes. Out of the total of 215 fish species available in state, more than 100 species are ornamental fishes. Illegal marketing of ornamental fishes collected from wild sources are going on unabated since long. This illegal trade has resulted in loss of valuable treasure without being replenished .Backyard farm / breeding centre will help in rearing these varieties collected judiciously from wild sources along with exotic ornamental fishes. Ornamental fishes have ready market and gives good return. Women farmers / entrepreneurs will be encouraged to adopt this economic activity for empowerment. The Department will explore every avenue and will tie up with CIFA & MPEDA for technical support and hands on practices Attempt is being made to popularize ornamental fish rearing among the women and Self Relp Department of Plans Groups (SHG) by assisting them to construct backyard hatcheries Govt of Aninashal Projects

Installation of FRP Carp hatcheries: -

The state is deficit in seed production. With the increase in Fishery / aquaculture activity demand for fish seed has increased many fold. Bulk of our demand is met by importing fish seed which expensive and drains our money. Moreover quality of fish seed is also not assured. Installation of hatcheries will at least guarantee availability of quality fish seed locally. Substantial demand can also be fulfilled reducing our dependence on outside sources. Fish seed basic support to fish farmers in marketing: A91 (4.)

Attempt will be made to link fish farms with markets by assisting the farmers providing transport facilities for sale in nearest market/consumer point. Since most of the fish farmers are from poor background they couldn't afford to hire vehicle for disposal of their produce because of which they had to sell their produce within at very cheap rate. It is a step towards organized marketing and will be beneficial to fish farmers.

Construction of modern hygienic fish market/ retail outlets:

Fishes are being sold in a most unhygienic manner throughout the state. There are no organized markets with facilities where the farmers can come and dispose off their produce. Modern fish retail outlets/ markets will be constructed in identified areas enabling the consumer and the farmers to access modern hygienic infrastructure, hygienic disposal and storage of fresh fish.

Progressive fish farmers/ stakeholder Meet:

It is proposed to provide a platform to progressive fish farmers and other stakeholders to participate and exchange their experiences and interact with experts. It will also help in disseminating information and technology with exposure. This in turn will give momentum to fisheries activities and will help in planning process and outlining strategies for future course of action basing on the inputs from the stake holders meet.

Assistance to fish farmers for Brood Bank development of indigenous fish species:

It is a new concept and step towards ex-situ conservation and a noble initiative to protect & propagate the germplasm of the indigenous species which is fast dwindling from our natural resources . Through this initiative the farmers will be encouraged to rear the species in their pond/raceways which would subsequently be used for angling/fish based eco-tourism. This will ensure sustained income in addition to the usual production of table fish.

Blue Revolution - Neel Kranti Mission:

Schemes under FFDA hitherto restructured for implementation in a Mission mode for a period of five years starting 2015-16 to 2019-20. The neel Kranti Mission has the vision to achieve economic prosperity of the country and the fish farmers and fishers as well as contribute towards food and nutritional security through full potential utilization of water resources for fisheries development in a sustainable manner. It focuses on tapping the full potential and enhance productivity, sustainability from aquaculture and fisheries resources and to ensure doubling of income of fishers and fish farmers

Reclamation of water logged areas :-

Foot hill areas of the state has vast water logged areas which cannot be put to agriculture use and are lying idle .Such areas will be reclaimed for aquaculture / fishery enhancement with little effort .Individuals, organizations, co-operative societies will be encouraged with financial assistance and technical support from the department.

Construction of New Ponds & tanks Development of Inland Fresh water Aquaculture (DIFA):-

Till now aquaculture is confined to homestead domestic ponds. Production from the pond is consumed locally without being surplus for marketing. Domestic fish pond doesn't sustain livelihood. Concepts of commercial fish farming have been introduced in recent past with development of minimum 0.5 ha. water area. Such farming ensures livelihood, enhanced production and sustained income. More earning from such venture will improve economic stability and social status of the farmers.

Rennovation of existing fish ponds: -

A large number of ponds have been constructed under various beneficiary oriented programme from different schemes. Because of unexpected nature's fury and economic backwardness of the farmers many ponds are left unutilized. With little effort and investment same can be rejuvenated and made functional which will have great impact on production and availability of table fish in the state.

Development of water logged areas:

Foot hill areas of the state has vast water logged areas which cannot be put to agriculture use and are lying idle. Such areas will be reclaimed for aquaculture/ fishery enhancement with little effort individuals, organizations, co-operative societies will be encouraged with financial assistance and technical support from the department. The state is deficit in seed production. With the increase in Fishery/aquaculture activity demand for fish seed has increased many fold. Bulk of our demand is met by importing fish seed from outside the state which is expansive and drains our money. Once operationalized quality

National Scheme for Welfare of Fishermen (NSWF):

It is a welfare scheme under Central Sector Scheme fully supported for the betterment of the farmers. Assistance for construction of dwelling units is provided to the fish farmers who are economically weaker and socially backward. Training and insurance cover of the active fish farmers are also supported under this scheme enabling the farmers to avail the benefit in case of unnatural death and accident.

Expected Outcome from the Scheme (Wherever Applicable):

Since most of the schemes are related to IG activities, it will definitely have an impact as far as increasing production and productivity of table fish & fish seed is concerned. All schemes will generate employment and provide self employment to a number of youth and women. The most notable among the schemes is the emphasis on quality seed production through hatcheries which will substantially reduce dependence on seed from outside. Once the seed producing infrastructures (both in private & Govt. sector) are strengthened there will be available seed for stocking of the water bodies. The HR Dev. programme will enhance the capability and skill of the stake holders which will help in effective implementation of schemes/projects.

Major target and proposed spatial distribution of fund: -

Target and spatial distribution of fund is as per the format DP-I while IG activities involving beneficiaries, will be done after proper feasibility study involving PRI representatives. Potential area / district will be the priority. Cluster approach will be adopted ensuring visible impact at field level and for effective monitoring and follow up.

Expected outcome:-

Since most of the schemes are IG activities, it will definitely have an impact as far as increasing production and productivity of table fish & fish seed is concerned. All schemes will generate employment and provide self employment to a number of youth and women.

Proposed guideline: -

- 1. Foot hill / potential district will be the priority and need based scheme will be preferred and prioritized.
- 2. Emphasis will be on bigger unit size considering sustained income and visible impact.
- 3. All schemes will be implemented complying state and Govt. of India guidelines / norms and in accordance with the GFR.
- 4. Selection of beneficiary will be transparent involving PRI and as per the feasibility.
- Monitoring will be done at local level by the Deputy Commissioner constituting a committee for effective implementation and judicious utilization of fund.
- 6. Internal monitoring from the Directorate will also be carried out to ensure effective implementation and check on quality.
- 7. Post implementation impact assessment will invariably be done and success stories will be properly documented.
- 8. Post implementation monitoring and technical guidance will be ensured.
- 9. Convergence of scheme will be explored for judicious and optimum utilization of available resource for the benefit of farmer and for welfare of community wherever applicable.
- 10. Database on assets created block wise and impact on economic status of farmer will be maintained .
- 11. All the Income Generating schemes will be linked with skill development .
- 12. For effective awareness programme on conservation and sustainable fisheries, School children, SHGs, NGOS and Co-operatives will be involved .
